1. When it comes to my family (either my immediate family or my extended family such as siblings or cousins) the current pandemic has, on the whole:



Has had no noticeable impact on our closeness with each other









We (the church) are commanded by Jesus to "love one another just as I have loved you" (as our "real" family), challenged by Peter to "love one another earnestly from a pure heart," and encouraged by Paul to give special consideration and even preference to those in need in the church. How can we nurture this kind of brotherly love during this pandemic?

- Financial help / individuals in the body
- Calling people to check up on them (CC)
- Alert to those without close (saved) family ... fellowship / pray /talk
- Community of safety, facing fears, pains, needs, honest expression of where we are
- Isolated WITH difficult (even dangerous) relationships / give people a safe connection / pray for them
- Show that the church is not just a building / BE the church / especially to the younger generation
- Exhibit brotherly love as a nurturing / random acts of love (surprise people, contact with nothing but love)
- Cards full of prayer and thanks
- Checking on each other through texts, cards, emails, etc.
